7 Medal of Honor un	der section 3741 of title 10, United
8 States Code, to Jam	es Megellas, formerly of Fond du Lac,

- 1 Wisconsin, and currently of Colleyville, Texas, for the acts
- 2 of valor described in subsection (b).
- 3 (b) ACTION DESCRIBED.—The acts of valor referred
- 4 to in subsection (a) are the actions of James Megellas on
- 5 January 28, 1945, in Herresbach, Belgium, during the
- 6 Battle of the Bulge, during World War II, when, as a first
- 7 lieutenant in the 82d Airborne Division, he led a surprise
- 8 and devastating attack on a much larger advancing enemy
- 9 force, killing and capturing a large number and causing
- 10 others to flee, single-handedly destroying an attacking
- 11 German Mark V tank with two hand-held grenades, and
- 12 then leading his men in clearing and seizing Herresbach.
- 13 (c) Waiver of Time Limitations.—The award
- 14 under subsection (a) may be made without regard to the
- 15 time limitations specified in section 3744(b) of title 10,
- 16 United States Code, or any other time limitation estab-
- 17 lished by law or regulation with respect to the awarding
- 18 of certain medals to persons who served in the Army.
